This Scholarship program founded by BMC has been in existence since 1941. Through the years, the prestigious college music scholarship program has awarded more than \$600,000 for developing talent in our state.

FYI...Your annual membership dues pay the cost of running our organization. Funding for Scholarships has been raised primarily at The Gala and with the Silent Auction. This year, we will not have a Silent Auction but broaden our reach beyond this one evening.

### In Remembrance of Toula Fulford, Founding Organizer of The Guild

In 1988 Penelope Cunningham asked Toula and Jo Campbell, who worked in the Music Club office, to assist her in creating The Guild of The Birmingham Music Club. Along with these ladies, there are twelve other founding members listed in our Guild directory.

Toula died on July 6, 2018 at the age of 95. Her former husband was well known attorney, Cliff Fulford, and she is the mother of longtime Guild member, Mary Helen McCoy, also a founder, who lives in Memphis, Tenn. Mary Helen is known for her interior design skills and knowledge of antiques.

Toula was an outstanding opera singer who after winning the Miss Alabama contest in 1943 went on to win Miss Congeniality in the Miss America contest that year.

A native of Birmingham, Toula was always involved in music and music performance in our city and supported many cultural organizations with her fund raising skills, talent and love.

Toula was a longtime Music Club board member and for many years was the liaison between The Guild and Music Club. She was delightful to know, always smiling and very pleasant to be around.
