## 2019 Scholarship Auditions

The 2019 Birmingham Music Club Guild Scholarship Auditions were held on Saturday, March 9 at Birmingham-Southern College. A total of 36 students entered the competition from eight different Alabama Colleges and Universities, including:

- Auburn University,
- Birmingham-Southern College
- University of Alabama
- University of Alabama at Birmingham
- University of Alabama in Huntsville
- University of Mobile
- University of Montevallo
- Samford University

Awards were given in three categories: Piano, Instrumental, and Voice. First Place winners received \$2,000, and Second Place winners, \$1,500.

In addition, the Walter Sechriest Best Performance Award was given for \$1,000 for the overall winner. The scholarship awards will be used during the 2019-2020 academic year toward music studies at their respective Alabama Universities.
